Serving the Community

Founded by Cokesbury Church in 2014, **Susannah's House** is an independent 501c3 non-profit organization. Their mission is to provide a source of hope for the pregnant or parenting mother following detox from opioids. These are women who want to maintain their sobriety. I met Cheryl, the House Coordinator at Susannah's House, who came through the program and is now celebrating three years of sobriety! Cheryl was able to regain custody of her daughter who is now four years old. Cheryl explained to me that the classes and the support from Susannah's House included involvement from the community and all of this was a huge part of her recovery! This place saved her life. We, at Central, want to lift up these women and their children with our prayers and physical gifts needed for them to grow and recover. They have an Amazon list for donations, and we are collecting items to deliver to them on a weekly basis. The needed items are shampoo, conditioner, body wash, clock radio, drawstring trash bags (medium, large, xl) 5 gallon trash cans with lids, crib mobiles, sound machines, waterproof crib mattress protector, first aid kit, bathroom accessories (towel rack, toilet paper holders, etc) and towel sets. **Please leave items in the far left corner of the Fellowship Hall.** Thank you, Central, for being a light in the lives of these women and children!

Snacks for Beaumont Academy - When a kid is hungry, it affects how they listen and how they learn. Central identified the need of supplying snacks in our schools through the development of our ministry with Beaumont Academy. Before Central began donating snacks, the teachers would cover the costs of providing snacks on their own. It's not in their job description as a teacher, but they were doing it to help their kids! Then Central stepped in to ease the financial burden on the teachers and to stop the hunger pains of the students. Whether a child eats lunch early (10:30 am) or late (12:10 pm), they have a long period of time in the school day to endure without the help of a snack. It's been proven that snacks help our brains in between meals regardless of our age! So when you buy *your* snacks this week at the grocery store, pick up additional snacks for our kids at Beaumont. Please remember they need to be individually packaged and no nuts or peanut butter to avoid allergies. Thank you, Central, for helping our children grow and learn.

Election Day Café — It's finally here! Tuesday, November 5, is only 3 weeks away. This is the big one, so our neighborhood voter turn out should be a large number. Our neighbors enjoy voting at Central UMC because they are greeted by friendly people and great refreshments. Sign-up sheets for a 2 hour shift and snacks are on the table under the sign-up board. Thank you for your Volunteer spirit!

At Central we are continuing our pursuit of justice by beginning our second season as Justice Knox members. We will kick-this-off with our JK House Meetings on Sunday, October 20th at noon (just after services) in Room 210 and Monday, October 21st at 6:30 pm in Room 209, and each will include a light meal. Missy Parker and Bruce Peters, our Justice Ministry co-leaders, ask that our current Justice Knox network members and all those potentially interested in becoming a member attend one of these House Meetings. You will have a forum to voice your community justice concerns that will be provided to the Justice Knox leadership for consideration as a Research to Action issue and an opportunity to commit, or for existing members re-commit, to Justice Knox.

Service Update Thank you, Central, for the donated crockpots for the residents of Minvilla Manor, the residential apartments managed by VMC, the Volunteer Ministry Center. The residents were so excited that everyone wanted one! And every resident that wanted one received one! We thought we needed 10 and we gave out 26! God is good! Thank you for your amazing generosity! There are two more opportunities in October! We prepare and serve a meal at the Volunteer Ministry Center, VMC, on Friday, October 17th. We need volunteers to help serve at 11:45 am to approximately 1 pm. In addition, the Pantry at Minvilla Manor has been moved up a day to Wednesday, October 23rd. Volunteers are needed from Noon to approximately 2 pm. You can sign up electronically in The Hub or on the sign up board outside of the sanctuary. Serving others in need just feels good. It's like knowing you are in the right spot at the right time! Volunteer and experience it for yourself!
