

## Devotional for the week of January 20, 2025

Romans 12:1-2 (Common English Bible)

"So, brothers and sisters, because of God's mercies, I encourage you to present your bodies as a living sacrifice that is holy and pleasing to God. This is your appropriate priestly service. Don't be conformed to the patterns of this world, but be transformed by the renewing of your minds so that you can figure out what God's will is - what is good and pleasing and mature."

We often hear about the ways the world call us to progress and perfection, but our faith calls us to live differently. Romans 12:1-2 suggest that in ALL we do — our sleeping, eating, going-to-work, and walking around lives we give to God as an offering. Romans 12:2 takes it a step further and urges us not to be "conformed to the patterns of this world, but be transformed by the renewing of your minds." As people who follow Jesus, this is a call that we cannot neglect. We are to engage our mind, body, spirit, hands and feet and reflect an all-compassing faith that changes us from the inside out.

In a season of polarizing politics and with an upcoming inauguration of a new president, we listen not to the ways of this world, but to our renewing faith in Christ. A faith that calls us - - no compels us to love one another whether we agree with them or not. This is the hard work of discipleship, but one in which Jesus is clear about.

The world is watching, not only we the people of the United States, but the world, including our children, are watching how we live out our faith - watching how we pursue justice and extend hospitality and embrace all — and allow our minds to be renewed and transformed by the power of the Holy Spirit alive in us.

As you prepare for the coming week, you are invited to pay attention to the ways in which you are renewing your mind and spirit. Pay attention to the ways in which you are specifically loving others. Pay attention to how you are navigating the political environment around you. Are you allowing yourself to be consumed by hate and divisiveness, or are you, like Nicodemus, seeking the way of the one whom God has sent to show us the way of love?

We do this alongside a watching world so that we can show the way of Christ.

#### Prayer for the week:

God who is with us and within us - in our going-to-work and walking-around lives - your presence gives way for deep purpose. In the coming days, weeks, and seasons ahead, may we find that through our prayers, we are able to show up within and throughout the world a little bit differently. As your people, in your holy church remind us what it means to be truly with and always for the world that you hold around us. Amen.
