Hands-On Mission Project 2025 Food Buckets for Zimbabwe

We are blessed to be part of a connectional church that works in all areas of our world. Central is part of the Holston Conference UMC, and this year's Annual Hands-On Mission is 500 Food Buckets for Zimbabwe, Ishe Anesu Project for Underprivileged Children. We at Central want to provide a minimum of 10 food buckets. This might seem like a drop in the bucket, so to speak; but there are 67 churches in our district, (Tennessee Valley District,) of the Holston Conference. If each congregation contributes 10 Food Buckets, we will surpass the goal of 500! You do the math! Let's do our part and make a difference to these children! The deadline is May 28th.

- ** Here are the instructions for filling a bucket: Purchase the food items from the list and pack inside a NEW 5 Gallon bucket with lid.**

 Please put the buckets in the 1st floor foyer in the nursery area.
- 1 bag self rising flour (4-5 lb)
- 1 bag sugar (4-5 lb)
- 1 bag of dried beans (2lb)
- 1 bottle of cooking oil (48 ounces or less)
- 1 bag of rice (2 lb)
- 1 box of powdered/dried milk (no larger than 64oz)
- 2 cans of meat: Ham (1 lb can), SPAM or Tuna (12 oz can)

Note: An \$8.00 donation for packing and shipping is to accompany each bucket. Please leave the monetary donation in the church office rather than putting it in the bucket.
